

BIBLIOGRAPHY AND METHOD

THE Walpole-Mann correspondence has not hitherto been completely printed. Walpole's letters to Mann have often appeared, the chief editions being as follows:

Letters of Horace Walpole Earl of Orford, to Sir Horace Mann, British Envoy at the Court of Tuscany. Now first published from the originals in the possession of the Earl of Waldegrave. Edited by Lord Dover. London, Richard Bentley, 1833, 3 vols. This included the letters in Walpole's and Kirgate's transcripts up to 28 Oct. 1760.

The Letters of Horace Walpole, Earl of Orford: including numerous letters now first published from the original manuscripts. Edited by John Wright. London, Richard Bentley, 1840, 6 vols. This reprinted the letters from Lord Dover's edition.

Letters of Horace Walpole, Earl of Orford to Sir Horace Mann, His Britannic Majesty's Resident at the Court of Florence, from 1760 to 1785. Now first published from the original MSS. Concluding series. [Edited by Bentley, Ollier, and Wright.] London, Richard Bentley, 1843-4, 4 vols. This completed the printing of Walpole's and Kirgate's transcripts.

The Letters of Horace Walpole, Fourth Earl of Orford. Edited by Peter Cunningham. London, Richard Bentley, 1857-9, 9 vols. Here for the first time the letters in Walpole's and Kirgate's transcripts were completely printed in one edition.

The Letters of Horace Walpole Fourth Earl of Orford chronologically arranged and edited with notes and indices by Mrs Paget Toynbee. Oxford, Clarendon Press, 1903-5, 16 vols. The previous editions had included no letters to Mann other than those in Walpole's and Kirgate's transcripts; this added Walpole's unsent letter of Dec. 1783, and his letter of 12 Feb. 1789 to the younger Sir Horace Mann.

Supplement to the Letters of Horace Walpole Fourth Earl of Orford chronologically arranged and edited with notes and indices by Paget Toynbee. Oxford, Clarendon Press, 1918, 2 vols.
