the 13th. of Feb. 1788, about six o'Clock
in the Evening, under the Park Pales near the
Lodge Gate, at Ampthill Park.

lord ossrey this is to let you know as i mean to be as good as my word and you have had one of my Men before your fine gestice but it is not him as set your last Place a fire but i be damd if it me as set the Place a fire and i wath your men aye way but i dund mean to have your house down till you are gone away i wont atempt your house til you are gon to london but your out Bildings take care on for i wol burn,u, out ove house and home if you dont go soon dam you blod wy dont you go to london for it is amost your time to go i now that i may begin my work and your man as you i heard you sent to sech the jestic the next time i meet him i be damd if i dont due him i know him) him well is name is thomas far and your damd Mr. william gordon i be damd if i dont due him and i be as good as my word to both an them and your Mr. hakins and all the damd Pafons an you with them and i com to your Play and you never axt me to drink but The rest you sent home in your coach and i had fost to wake lady ostrey i dont men to hurt but the house shal come down wen you leve it and i wish i die this minut if i dint set all your Placcs on fire and i be damd if i dint set your carpet r shop on fire my own silf for one of my Men dam him he begins to ~~scree~~ a redy but dam him he shant live live lond he run away that night up amost up to your hove and i thot he was a coming to tel you wat i had been duing of and he is dead now and is ass is cold i wol drive you away if i can i be damd if i dont
