

## APPENDIX 1

### HORACE WALPOLE'S TWICKENHAM 1747-1797

**T**HIS appendix includes a map of Twickenham, showing the houses of the residents that Walpole mentions in his letters while he lived there from 1747 until his death in 1797; a list of the residents, giving their dates of occupancy and the sources from which the dates have been ascertained; and the complete text of Walpole's poem 'The Parish Register of Twickenham.'

The owners and tenants identified on the map are Walpole's contemporaries; earlier residents are for the most part omitted. Where more than one person occupied a house during the period, the name next to the house on the map is that of the earlier occupant. The dates of occupancy encompass the earliest and latest dates for which we have a record, but in some instances occupancy may have begun earlier or extended beyond the dates given.

We are deeply indebted for the list to Mrs Warren G. Creamer, who has been a volunteer in the Print Room at Farmington from its installation in 1954 and who has made Walpole's Twickenham a special study. The map itself is based primarily on 'A Plan of Twickenham in the County of Middlesex from an Actual Survey by Samuel Lewis, 1784,' which appeared as the frontispiece to Edward Ironside's *The History and Antiquities of Twickenham*, 1797 (reproduced as the back endpaper to MORE). It has been adapted for our purpose and executed by Edith McKeon Abbott, of Brookline, Massachusetts.

A list of cue titles used in the documentation precedes the list of Twickenham residents. Numbers in boldface type refer to volumes in the Yale Walpole Edition.
