## VOLUMES I AND II

- GEORGE MONTAGU BY VAN LOO i. 35  
From the original at Boughton, Kettering, in the possession of the Duke of Buccleuch. The photograph of this picture was given by the late C. H. Montagu-Douglas-Scott to the late Paget Toynbee who gave it, in 1929, to wsl. The portrait is identified on the back and dated 1739.
- VIEW OF RADNOR HOUSE AND TWICKENHAM FROM STRAWBERRY HILL i. 53  
From the water-colour drawing by Müntz, annotated by Walpole, in Walpole's extra-illustrated copy of the *Description of Strawberry Hill*, 1784, now wsl.
- THE DUKE OF RICHMOND'S FIREWORKS TO CELEBRATE THE PEACE, 1749 i. 80
- THE MANDARIN CATS i. 134  
From the original pen and ink drawing by Bentley for Gray's 'Ode on the Death of a Favourite Cat.' It was first published in *Designs by Mr. R. Bentley for Six Poems by Mr. T. Gray*, 1753. It forms part of the 'valuable MS' (i. 116) and is now wsl.
- MONTAGU'S MONUMENT TO HIS FAMILY i. 200  
Designed by Walpole, in the church at Horton.
- BENTLEY'S DESIGN FOR A COLUMBARIUM AT THE VYNE i. 216  
Now wsl. The figures are in Bentley's hand; the note in Walpole's.
- HORACE WALPOLE, BY ECCARDT, ABOUT 1755 i. 269  
The original is in the National Portrait Gallery. Walpole is painted in Van Dyck dress.
- MONTAGU'S BOOK-PLATE i. 282  
In his copy of Müntz's *Encaustic*, given by Walpole to Montagu, now wsl. The signature is Montagu's.
